It was our ancestors who established the first civil government in Texas in that same year. Today the Villa is known as the City of San Antonio. It is with pride that our members celebrate what our ancestors started is flourishing today.

Our organization was established in 1977 to honor those 16 families by encouraging and promoting historical genealogical research, enhancing the historical value and significance of their accomplishments, providing educational programming, assisting schools with the sharing of our story, and providing guest speakers at schools and for other organizations.
